Command Sgt. Maj. Kyle S. Brunell currently serves as the Command Sergeant Major for the 68th Theater Medical Command in Sembach, Germany.

Command Sgt. Maj. Brunell is a native of Ballston Spa, NY. In 1991, he enlisted in the United States Army. He then completed Basic Training at Fort Jackson, SC, and AIT at Fitzsimons Army Medical Center in Aurora, CO and received his training as an Optical Laboratory Specialist.

Previously he served as the Command Sgt. Maj. of the United States Army Medical Research and Development Command at Fort Detrick, MD, Regional Health Command-Europe in Sembach, Germany, Carl R. Darnall Army Medical Center at Fort Hood, TX, and Keller Army Community Hospital in West Point, NY.

Among his accomplishments, he participated in the Military Personnel Exchange Program as an Instructor at the Unteroffizierschule des

Heeres (German Army NCO Academy) in Delitzsch, Germany.

Command Sgt. Maj. Brunell served as a First Sergeant at Kenner Army Health Clinic at Fort Lee, VA, and C Co. 1-214th Aviation Regiment (AA) in Landstuhl, Germany and Camp Dwyer, Afghanistan. Additionally, he served as the Optical Lab NCOIC and Detachment Sergeant of USAMMCE in Pirmasens, Germany. His added assignments include AIT Instructor at Naval Weapons Station, Yorktown, VA, Fort Eustis, VA, Fitzsimons Army Medical Center, CO, and 226th MEDSOM, Pirmasens, Germany.

Command Sgt. Maj.
