U.S. Army Sergeant First Class, Jared A. Young, a Senior Military Intelligence Systems Maintainer/Integrator at 66th Military Intelligence Brigade began his military career upon enlisting in the U.S. Army on April 23, 2003. After completing Basic Training, he quickly established himself as a dedicated and skilled Intelligence professional. The devoted father to six children hails from the Tidewater area in Virginia.

SFC Young is a graduate of Woodside High School and furthered his education by attending American Military University and Cochise College. His commitment to lifelong learning and professional development is evident in his extensive military education, which includes the U.S. Army Senior Leaders Course, Advanced Leaders Course, Warriors Leaders Course, Distributed Common Ground System - Army (DCGS-A) Maintenance Course, Knowledge Management Course, and various specialized intelligence and security courses. These include training at the U.S. Joint Forces Command (USJFCOM) Joint Forces Intelligence School and certifications such as CompTIA Security Plus (SEC+), CompTIA Advanced Security Practitioner (CASP+), CompTIA Linux Plus (Linux+), Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) Course, Knowledge Management Professional (KMPro) and Microsoft SharePoint Administrators Course.

Back on home soil, SFC Young played a pivotal role as the NCOIC Senior Intelligence Systems Training Developer (Military Occupational Specialties 35N, 35P, 35Q, 35S, 35T and 353T) at the United States Intelligence Center of Excellence, Fort Huachuca, Arizona. His last position as the NCOIC Senior Military Intelligence Systems Maintainer/Integrator for the 66th Military Intelligence Brigade in Wiesbaden, Germany, marked the culmination of a career characterized by dedication, innovation, and leadership.
