

Eligibility for Veterans living in Germany

Veterans identified as Purple Heart recipients, former prisoners of war, veterans with documented service-connected disabilities or their VA documented caregivers (on their behalf) are granted access to a number of expanded benefits thanks to the signing of the “National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019” and an exception approval granted by German Customs Authorities.

What does this mean?

Since January 2020 the above listed veteran groups and their caregivers are eligible to use U.S. Forces Sales Facilities on U.S. Military Installations in Germany to make purchases when residing in Germany and being in possession of a “Pink Card”.

What if I am not residing in Germany but only visiting?

Visitors have to stay in Germany for at least 30 uninterrupted days to be eligible for a “Pink Card”. It is highly recommended to bring your travel itinerary when registering with the U.S. Army Customs Agency – Europe field office as described in this brochure.

What is the process to obtain approval for shopping?

You will first need to obtain a U.S. Forces Status Verification (AE Form 550-175K) from a U.S. Army Customs Agency – Europe (USACA-E) field office.

The Verification has a maximum validity period of one year.

You will have to present the following documentation:

- **Valid Passport**
- **Valid residence permit for Germany; Immigration stamp for tourists/ visitors (if applicable)**
- **Veterans Health Identification Card (VHIC) reflecting the eligibility status**



What is the next step?

The AE Form 550-175K must be presented to your responsible German Customs Office for further processing and issuance of the actual authorization forms 0216 and form 0217 (“Pink Card”).

In order to access U.S. Forces Sales Facilities you will need both your respective VHIC and “Pink Card”.

Remember:

- **Purchase of rationed items is not permitted.**
- **All purchases are for personal use only and resale or transfer is not permitted.**
- **You must present the “Pink Card” no later than the 5th business day of each month to the issuing German Customs Office together with ALL original sales receipts for purchases made in the previous month.**

German customs will levy duties based on the € exchange rate applicable in the month when the purchases were made (for further details please go to www.zoll.de).

For items with a **single item sales price of less than the U.S. \$ equivalent of 50 Euro** German Customs will levy duties calculated by means of a flat rate of duty (currently 17.5%).

For items with a **single item sales price of the U.S. \$ equivalent of 50 Euro and more** duties will be calculated on the basis of the customs tariff and the relevant tax regimes (customs duties, excise duties and import value-added taxes).

What if I'm not able to shop myself due to a medical condition or handicap?

The entitled person can appoint their VA authorized primary or family caregiver as a **Shopping Assistant** under a separate agreement with Host Nation Authorities.

This Shopping Assistant can register and shop on the behalf of the entitled person. Following (additional) documentation is required at the USACA-E field office:

- **Primary or Family Caregiver Letter issued by Veterans Affairs (VA)**
- **Written request for Shopping Assistant Authorization, dated and signed by the VHIC holder**
- **Passport / Personalausweis of VA authorized primary or family caregiver with valid residence permit or other immigration documents (if applicable).**

Please note: Letters are issued by VA annually in December. This may restrict the validity period of AEF 550-175K and the "Pink Card".

On receipt of the AE Form 550-175K the German Customs Office will issue a "Pink Card" with the remark "Erfüllungsgehilfe". The shopping assistant is the only person authorized to shop on behalf of the entitled veteran. The shopping agent is not authorized to shop on their own behalf (again, as agreed to with Host Nation Authorities).

All forms will be issued on a walk-in basis.
